You should know your cousin is an admired and loved member of our congregation. He has a heart of gold, and when he wanted to connect with you, I simply wanted to do what I could - because I knew he could not have accomplished what he wanted to do - and sharing the pleasure with you would be wonderful. Hold tight with whatever plans you have to explore working with Skype. I will shortly let you know if I can come up with a solution. For the moment I need to know if I make arrangements - are you able to go to an address near the center of Jerusalem. If so I have a little work to do. If both you and Herschel can be connected by Skype, hopefully Apple's FaceTime - then the two of you can chat with non verbal communications, scribble your responses and at my end I can repeat what Herschel wants expressed and the same repeated in Israel. We will certainly be able to make the Internet connection very satisfying. To make this process even more effective our congregation has a Rabbi who is extraordinary. He has led our high holiday services - both as Rabbi and Chazzan - for close to fifteen years. Rabbi Katzew and our entire congregation appreciate Herschel as a community treasure. If Rabbi Katzew will be in Jerusalem before he returns to the States I have a plan that should be rewarding for all concerned. I only need for the moment confirmation you will be able to go to a place yet to be defined - perhaps close to the old and renovated train station. I await your response as I will begin to coordinate a plan that will be rewarding for all involved.
